Editorial (Jeremy Tullett)

So ... at the third attempt, I managed to extract a contract for **Mid***Con* 2017 from the Hallmark Hotel. The duty manager was duly mortified at the email trail that I showed her, displaying several requests for a draft contract going ignored, and was unable to understand why the Sales and Marketing and team hadn't been all over me since January.

There seems to have been a bit of confusion about the date, but we have got a contract for **17-19 November 2017**. *Note, that this is change from the usual weekend, and may be not the dates that you were expecting.*

We do, however, get to avoid the Remembrance Sunday two-minute silence, when (at the hotel's request), it seems, we all have to be quiet, and listen to the kitchen staff chattering away.

The other point of note is that there will definitely be an £8/day car park charge to be paid at the meter or at reception. I'll find out later if it is possible to pay up front for two or three days, and also whether partial days attract partial parking fees. Notwithstanding the difficulty of lugging a bag of games around the country, anyone attending the convention form the East or West Midlands, or South Yorkshire may well find that is cheaper to get the train.

Otherwise arrangements remain the same as last year. The Hallmark Inn lounge proved to be a popular destination for people looking for a quieter location to play games in, so we've retained that booking for 2017.

The other change you may notice is that I probably won't be glued to the reception desk all weekend. Our latest committee member proposed rather strongly that we ought to have a duty rota, an idea that got my support!

I'd also like to try better to use technology this year. We have a Twitter feed and a Facebook page, I am told (LinkedIn is as far as I get with this social media nonsense), but with so many of the convention attendees carrying smartphones and tablets, it must surely be possible to use them to post information in real time, such as reminding people that meals are about to start, the Bring 'n' Buy is open, or that only five more players are needed

for Railway Rivals¹.

The office cricket team for which I play had its first fixture on the 25th April. I wasn't available to play that night, but the game was "rained off", a shorthand for "the batting side was playing in failing light, while facing, by turn, showers of rain, snow, and sleet". The game the following week wasn't much better, I gather, but this week's (9th May) was actually played under a sunny sky on a moderately warm evening. Successive fixture secretaries have gone for early starts to the season (we are not a league team), but it has always struck me as slightly bonkers to try to play a 6pm fixture before the first May Bank Holiday, on the grounds of poor light and weather.

I am the keeper of the team statistics, and the main scorer, which is why I generally bat at 11 (that, and most of the other players are better batsmen). However, I am a reasonably handy bowler on a good day ^(C).

Scoring is Manorcox – Manorcon in Oxford, see – where I have shamelessly ripped off Manorcon's sum-of-squares derived system and added bonus points for players who top a board by themselves (ie first on the board, not first equal!)

 \succ We have a choice of two (yes, two!) welcome dinners on the Thursday night – a maximumposhness four-course formal dinner in the St John's Great Hall for those who wish to partake of that, and a very rustic and authentic Oxford meal in an extremely friendly local establishment for those on a smaller budget. So there's every reason to join us from Thursday!

> Whichever round you choose to skip, there's plenty for you to do - and for your significant other as well, should they be along to enjoy this spectacular city!

MidCon 2016 Report (Jeremy Tullett)

The Convention

Mid*Con* XXXVIII takes place in the comfortable Hallmark Hotel in Derby from Friday morning (9am) to Sunday evening (6pm).

Mid*Con* is about playing games and meeting people. You can play any of the number of games people bring along with them, including the hot new games from the Spiel games fair in Essen, which takes place just a few weeks before *MidCon*. Popular games include 18XX, Puerto Rico, Power Grid and Agricola, but you are welcome to bring along your own favourite games – you will almost certainly find some people willing to play at least one of them.

The convention features:

- the opportunity to play board games with other gamers
- the **Mid***Con* general knowledge quiz for teams of 4 on Saturday evening
- a games shop
- a Bring & Buy stall where you can sell your games, or pick up a bargain
- a Diplomacy tournament (numbers permitting)
- special events, as detailed elsewhere

Fees

Attendance at **Mid***Con* costs £25-£30 for the whole weekend (day rates of £15 for each of Friday and Saturday, £10 for Sunday) and accommodation is available in the Hallmark Hotel or its sister establishment, the Hallmark Inn, at reasonable rates. Both hotels have dedicated car parks with a small daily parking charge. The Hallmark Inn is 50 metres from the Hallmark Hotel, across the street.

Derby railway station is about 50 metres away, and there is a bus link from there to East Midlands airport.

The City

Derby has an Intu centre for shoppers, and old 'cathedral quarter', and a number of interesting museums. There are at least two dining areas in the city (one near to the hotels), and a busy nightlife as well as several 'real ale' pubs.

The organization for ManorCon XXXV is proceeding well. If you haven't booked yet, remember that you can do so in two ways. You can book online via PayPal or a credit or debit card – visit http://www.manorcon.org.uk/book.htm and follow the links. Or you can still post a form and cheque – the form can be found at the same place if you need one (and the form is also in the previous QLA, or can be requested by phone/post/email – see below for contact details). Please remember that **advance registration is only available until 17**th **June.** After this, you will have to register at the door and pay higher registration fees and accommodation charges (and you may not get any accommodation at all – our supply of rooms is fairly limited).

If you have booked, but need to cancel all or some of your booked accommodation, you should inform us as soon as possible. If you cancel by the booking deadline, then you will definitely avoid cancellation charges. Thereafter, the later you leave it to inform us, the more likely you are to suffer accommodation cancellation charges.

The venue is the same as last year; the bedrooms will be in John Foster Hall, as they have been for the last 4 years; and the rest of the convention will be across the road in Stamford Court. Please note that entry will not be permitted before 12 noon on Friday.

ManorCon is run by volunteers, and does not aim to make a profit. In order for us to keep this tradition, we ask for volunteers for a number of tasks. One of these is help with the registration desk, usually by manning the desk for an hour on the Friday afternoon. If anybody asks anything you don't know, just point them at the nearest committee member – it's not difficult. If you would like to help us out and failed to mention it when booking, please e-mail us at regdesk@manorcon.org.uk.

This year, as usual, we will have a variety of tournaments and events.

- Midnight Party three rounds, at midnight each evening.
- **18XX** (ad-hoc i.e. play where and when you wish); there will be trophies for 1^{st} to 3^{rd} .
- **Pop Quiz** on Saturday evening, run by Dan Lester.
- **Treasure Hunt** This "jolly good" event for teams of ~4-5 will take place on Sunday afternoon at 2pm.
- Paul Grogan from **Gaming Rules!** is planning to run a tournament, as well as providing demos for various publishers, including:
 - Adrenaline (CGE): Tournament at 2pm on Saturday. Also, demos of the new 6th player expansion which includes team mode!
 - **Codenames Duet (CGE):** Fully co-operative Codenames, designed for 2 players, but plays with more.
 - **'Pleiades' (CGE):** A new sci-fi style Euro from Vladimir Suchy, designer of Last Will, Prodigal's Club, and a few more!
 - **'Questions' (CGE):** Another party game from Vlaada Chvatil, designer of Through the Ages, Codenames, and many more.
 - Expansions for Tash-Kalar and Through the Ages (CGE).
 - One or two games from What's Your Game? possibly even Brasil.
 - Alexandria, IUNU, Long Live the Queen, maybe others too (Ludicreations).
 - **Gloomhaven (Cephalofair)**: The game with the huge box that has been the hottest game on BoardGameGeek for a couple of months!
 - Various games from Space Cowboys, including Sherlock Holmes Consulting Detective, Watson & Holmes, and TIME Stories.

- Games Stall. Once again, Milestone Games will be running a games stall for new games and gaming accessories. They will provide a 15% discount to all purchases, and there will be some special offers as well. If there is anything specific you would like, you can contact them at sales@milestonegames.co.uk.
- Second Hand Games Sale as usual, this will be open for two one-hour sessions on Friday and Saturday. Potential helpers are very much welcome contact Steve Bailey (steve21356@ntlworld.com) for more information.

Should numbers permit, there may be **Diplomacy** – individual rounds at 1800 on Friday, 1000 on Saturday, and 1000 on Sunday.
